

Pack 28 Camping Rules

- ◆ The Scout Oath & Scout Law are the rules that govern our conduct.
- ◆ Use the Buddy System at all times.
- ◆ Scouts are expected to use Outdoor Ethics (formerly known as Leave No Trace) and participate in this procedure with the Pack on the last morning of the campout.
- ◆ Children can only sleep in a tent with an adult if that adult is their Parent or Legal Guardian. Only tent camping is permitted.
- ◆ Parents (or Guardians) are responsible for their children during the campout (conduct, discipline, safety, etc.).
- ◆ No running will be allowed in or around the camping areas for safety reasons.
- ◆ Cannot use Liquid Fuels to start fires (i.e. no charcoal lighter fluid, etc.). Must use solid starters or match-light charcoal.
- ◆ No scouts are permitted to play in the fires (no sticks, leaves, etc.) Once a stick has been inside the fire ring, it must stay in the fire ring. Roasting should be done with appropriate roasting sticks and under adult supervision.
- ◆ No chemical fueled stoves or lanterns or open flames of any kind may be used inside tents (for your own safety).
- ◆ Youth are not allowed to carry or use knives on the Pack Family Campout, unless it is apart of an approved scouting activity, with parent's permission and the scout has their Whittling Chip (Bears and Webelos). *Scout must carry Whittling Chip card with them at all times.
- ◆ Cub Scouts are not allowed to use Axes or Hatchets. Adults can only use Axes and Hatchets on Cub Scout Campouts if they are used in a roped off and visibly marked "Ax Yard".
- ◆ No guns or firearms of any kind are allowed on Pack Family Campouts.
- ◆ No pets are allowed on Pack Family Campouts.
- ◆ No electronic entertainment devices are allowed on Pack Family Campouts.
- ◆ Shoes must be worn at all times. Open-toes shoes are not allowed for safety reasons.
- ◆ All scouts will report to their tents at 10:00. Quiet time for adults is midnight.
- ◆ Smoking should only be done away from the camping area (away from the youth).
- ◆ The Boy Scouts of America prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at any activity involving participation of youth members.
